I write to you today to ask for your understanding of my situation and to request for an exception to the exam application fee policy.

I have an application on file with you and have already paid all fees. I anticipated taking the December 2017 exam. However, due to an unforeseen and urgent family emergency with my mom being very ill, I am unable to take the practical exam as scheduled. I would like to take the exam next year in December 2018, but I understand that I would have to pay the application fee of \$1,000 again. At the moment, this is very difficult for me. Due to my situation, I cannot afford to pay this fee again. With the stress of student loan expenses, medical expenses for my mom, and all the emotional distress from everything that is going on, I am not sure how I can find a way to get the money for this. Thus, I would like to kindly ask for your help to waive the application fee so that I can take the exam again when I re-apply next year.

For some background, I am a recent graduate and have just moved to Nevada to start a new career. I wanted to be an acupuncturist in Nevada and was looking forward to taking the Nevada exam. Although I have a California license, I understand that in order to take your state exam, I have to first take the Nationals. But, again, because of my current family situation, I had to focus on taking care of my mom and finding ways to pay for medical and financial living cost. As such, I didn't have the time to study nor was I able to mentally focus. Therefore, I was not able to take the National exam by the deadline. Hence, without a license, I am unable to find a suitable job that can support my family. This financial burden has been very stressful. I don't think I can afford to pay another \$1,000 for the application fee again.

In summary, if by chance there is some way, I would very much appreciate it if you can make an exception for my circumstances and help to waive this fee.
