it, which is to protect the public from harm, and revealed a secondary goal for enterprise. She thought that the comments were more in line for an association.

Dear Board Members,

Looking into in the SB 355 proposed changes and updates to our current statutes, we find that the majority of these recommendations are valid and mostly agreeable with of our association members. I had some discussion with our members and most of us understand that Nevada is a fast growing state with a rapid growth in population which triggers a demand for more medical providers including Acupuncturists. We understand the Board is in the process to facilitate entry to new licensee seekers and is proposing to remove the state exam entirely except for the jurisprudence exam portion. As you are aware that the Nevada Oriental Medicine educational requirements exceed the requirements of most other states acupuncture licensing boards. The state of Nevada requires at least 2800 to 3000 hours of instruction including 2500 didactic hours. In addition candidates must pass all NCCAOM exams and our pratical exam NRS 634A. 120 (b) covering the following topics medical science, acupuncture, herbal medicine, English proficiency, as well as the laws and regulations relating to health and safety in the practice of OM in Nevada. The reason that the state of Nevada has such stringent requirements for licensure is because we do grant the title of Oriental Medicine Doctor (OMD) to our licensee whereas most states in the country only grant the title of Licensed Acupuncturist (Lac) with NCCAOM certification as the only requirement for their licensure. (check all our surrounding and neighboring states) We strongly believe that standard should always increase and not decrease in every profession i.e. physical Therapy has now reached to Doctorate program; in pharmacy etc. If we decide to low our standard and requirements then we should also abolish the title of OMD to new licensee seekers and grant them as Licensed Acupuncturist (LAc) with the exception of those that obtained degree as DAOM.

#### Dear Nevada State Board of Oriental Medicine:

This letter is being written to formally request a review of didactic hours for consideration of testing and future licensure.

In previously documented correspondence regarding this subject, Bastyr University included 339 hours of case preparation and case discussion that were not included in the calculation for didactic hours. Included in these hours were also an externship to China in which a percentage of the 339 hours were spent overseas practicing oriental medicine.

In regard to testing and future licensure; I attended Bastyr University from 2009 to 2013 and completed the combined BS/MSAOM program. I am NCCAOM certified and had a private practice with hundreds of patients over the course of four years in the state of Washington. I am acquainted with two other Bastyr graduates, Chad Bachman and Faith Noborikawa. We completed the same program at Bastyr University during the same time period, and they have both relocated from Washington to Nevada. They were granted licensure by obtaining this same letter to verify didactic hours from Bastyr University in which the case preparation/case discussion hours where included as part of their didactic hours. It appears that Bastyr has set a precedent for the calculation of didactic hours that they are not currently maintaining.

Since Bastyr University is not able to maintain consistency with their didactic calculations, I'm requesting the board's assistance in examining this matter. My goal is to be granted a license so that I may open a practice in the state of Nevada to help people. The repercussions of having to take a year's worth of classes to meet an hourly requirement will put a significant financial burden on my family and may delay my licensure for another one or two years, given the testing timetable. I returned to Nevada to be home with my family, and I would like to be a contributing member of the natural health community. I will respect the process and I understand that certain criteria need to be met, however, based on the precedent that has been set, further review and consideration is needed and will be greatly appreciated.

This letter is being written to formally request to include my didactic hours for General Chemistry and General Biology taken at North Seattle Community College in consideration of testing and future licensure.

In previously documented correspondence regarding this subject, Bastyr University included 44 hours for General Chemistry and 44 hours for General Biology. It was later found that the registrar was incorrect in adding this to the Bastyr didactic hours calculation as they stated that it was pre-requisite to the program. The chairperson of the AEAM program and I reviewed the catalogue of Ms. Galloway's entering year, and reviewed her transcript again, line by line. Three classes (TCM Diagnosis, Microbiology Lab and Whole Foods Production) formerly were comprised of 11 more hours than in our current curriculum, and one class, Into to Botany (44 hours,) is no longer required. Nutrition and Dietary Systems for 33 hours was not included in the original calculation as it was taken at North Seattle Community College. As a result, the revised didactic and total hours completed below are increased by a total of 110 hours.

The total number of hours Ms. Galloway completed for the MSAOM program is 3391, including 2035 didactic hours and 1356 hours of clinical training. Please note, of the 1356 clinical hours, 339 hours are dedicated to case preparation and case discussion. (The hours as originally calculated are: 1925 didactic and 1356 clinical, totaling 3281.)
