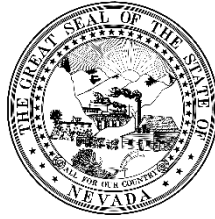

SMALL BUSINESS IMPACT STATEMENT
CHANGES TO NAC 634A

Changes to NAC 634A Small Business Impact Statement Pursuant to NRS233B.0608:

On 3/3/2022, a small business impact survey and the proposed regulation changes were sent to all licensed Oriental Medicine Doctors and requestors on the mailing list to determine the impact of the proposed regulations. Also, the small business impact survey is posted on the website of the Board of Oriental Medicine along with the proposed regulation changes.

The Board of Oriental Medicine received 2 responses indicating that there was no economic impact on their businesses.

2. The manner in which the analysis was conducted (if an impact was determined).

On 3/3/2022, a small business impact survey and the proposed regulation changes were sent to all licensed Oriental Medicine Doctors and requestors on the mailing list to determine the impact of the proposed regulations. Also, the small business impact survey is posted on the website of the Board of Oriental Medicine along with the proposed regulation changes. No economic impact was indicated by the small business impact surveys.

3. The estimated economic effect of the proposed regulation on small businesses:

a. Both adverse and beneficial effects

There is no adverse impact based upon the small business impact survey. The benefits include provisions relating to qualifications of applicants, sections in the state exam, carryover credits of continuing education, deletion of prorated fees, elimination of certain Board fees, fee language is amended to allow for flexibility, and acceptance of credit and debit cards, and non-refundability of state exam fees, renewal fees and other matters properly relating thereto.

b. Both direct and indirect effects

See 3 a. Also, the proposed regulation is not expected to impose an economic burden upon small businesses or restrict the formation, operation or expansion of small businesses.
